## Commitment Series Selfish Deople

#### Are you surrounded by selfish people?

A selfish person is defined as one who cares only about one's self and has no consideration of others. A person that uses "I" or "ME" is considered selfish, but not when God used it; because He has the authority to and states what is.

Selfish people will leave you feeling drained, like the life has been sucked out of you; they will put you in a terrible state. They are determined to pull you down, so they can feel better. The state of unforgiveness creates a selfish person. They don't encompass any joy, peace or happiness; the only motive/agenda they have is to get what they want and attack the Christ in YOU. They may get what they "want", but never get what they "need".

#### Get rid of the stones

The stones in our lives are stumbling blocks and those stumbling blocks can be selfish people. To overcome these stones is to implement the "bread" given by God; which is the "word" of God. We need to yearn for God constantly, stay focused and rooted with the Lord. We may have our own minds and our own ways, but if we continue to TRUST GOD and allow Him to guide our steps over these stumbling blocks we can stand in His righteousness and be victorious.

Then Jesus was led by the Spirit into the wilderness to be tempted there by the devil. For forty days and forty nights he fasted and became very hungry.
